- May's government is weak but nasty. They depend on the DUP to survive.
- The Tories continue to use the future of EU citizens as a bargaining chip in Brexit negotiations.
- May has stoked up Islamophobia in the wake of the London and Manchester terrorist attacks with her talk of "enough is enough". Against this background the far right have tried to mobilise, with marches and a terror attack at Finsbury Park Mosque in North London.

- Thousands of refugees still face death fleeing war and poverty, while the Tories continue to scapegoat refugees and migrants. They are blamed for overstretched public services instead of the real culprit – austerity.
- The growth in support for Jeremy Corbyn and his stand against racism.
- Alongside the growth of the left there is a clear rise in racism, Islamophobia and antisemitism, highlighted by the sharp rise in hate crimes.
- At last year's conference 1,600 delegates heard Jeremy Corbyn, Diane Abbott, Sally Hunt, Kevin Courtney and others debate the way forward.
