# REFUGEES ARE

# WELCOME HERE

**The sheer scale of the climate emergency we are facing is existential, and people are waking up to urgency of the need to act now.**

The impact of climate change is displacing millions of people around the world. It is a crisis which is overwhelmingly caused by the rich and big business, driven by capitalism, and the effects are already being felt disproportionately by those in the global south.

In the last six years, over 140 million people were forced to move because of climate and weather related disasters: droughts, harvest failures and devastating storms. We know that last year 24 million people were displaced by weather related disasters like floods and hurricanes.

While the displacement figures cannot all be simplistically reduced to climate change alone, they do give us a picture of what to expect as climate change worsens the frequency and severity of such disasters. Climate change is now a central factor driving people to flee their homes, interacting with other forces, such as war, conflict and poverty.

## Sea levels

The mean global sea level has risen by 10 - 20 cm over the past century with the annual rate doubling in the past 20 years. This has largely been attributed to thermal expansion, melting glaciers (or polar ice caps), and ice loss from Greenland and Antarctica.

Island countries are the most affected by the rising sea levels, and many examples across the Pacific Ocean and Indian Ocean are at risk from rising sea levels and the impact of increasing sea temperatures on corals, as well as cyclones.

Countries that sit at a low elevation are also very much at risk, for example in Bangladesh or in Vietnam.



The Guardian newspaper reported that rising sea levels could displace 30 million people by the end of the century.

Stand Up To Racism stands in full solidarity with those fighting to build an effective movement over climate change.

Racism is at the heart of the agenda of governments in the west— if climate change affects the global south it's not seen as a serious problem, and when millions flee its disastrous consequences, they are scapegoated, detained or left to drown.

## 'Hostile environment'

It is essential that as part of the inspiring and growing mass global movement for the climate, anti racism and defence of refugees and migrants is at its centre.

As millions are displaced, they face the deliberately engineered and so called 'Hostile Environment' in Britain, and disgustingly racist anti-migrant and refugee policies from the US, Australia, and across Europe.

From Trump, to Johnson and Farage, to Bolsonaro, to the rising far right across Europe, to mainstream politicians—it is the very people who are attacking and scapegoating refugees and migrants and pushing racist and devastating fortress border policies who are also to blame for the failure to stop climate chaos.

Bolsonaro's policies in Brazil have stunned the world this summer, with the horrifying Amazon fires. In 2019 there has been a 77 percent increase from the same period in 2018 in fires in the world's largest rainforest which provides us with 20 percent of the world's oxygen.

## Back the climate strike: 20 Sep & build solidarity with refugees

Trump is the world's no.1 climate change denier, and he is the world's no.1 racist. He uses his office to give credence to a dangerous ideology, fanning the flames of the far right and fascist terrorists.

Boris Johnson has rejected climate science more than once despite promising to lobby Trump to do more about climate change.

The bold fight by campaigners from Greta Thunberg to Extinction Rebellion and the #YouthStrike4Climate has been deeply inspiring. We need anti racism to be at the centre of this new movement, and we need to organise to oppose all forms of racism, Islamophobia and antisemitism, and the rise of a dangerous far right.
